2 Course Goals

Welcome to Astronomy! In this course we will study the myriad objects which make up the universe, survey its history, and explore the microscopic basis behind the many phenomena we observe. Specific course goals include:

- 1. Understadning the scale (size) of different astronomical objects,
- 2. learning the subatomic constituents of matter, and
- 3. mastering problem solving using proportions.

3 Textbook

The textbook for this course is *The Cosmos: Astronomy in the New Millennium*, 3rd ed. by Jay Pasachoff and Alex Filippenko. We will cover all the chapters in the book, but some will be emphasized more than others.

4 Grades

The course grade will be based on the following formula:

- Homework (15 %)
- Midterms (4 @ 15% each = 60%)
- Final Exam (25 %)

There will also be at night some "observations" at which extra credit can be earned. Grades will be assigned on the standard 90/80/70/60 ABCD scale, though I may adjust this scale (usually downward) so that it coincides with gaps in the grade distribution. This a way, a few points do not make a difference in the overall grade.

4.1 Homework

Homework will assigned through Blackboard. It will generally be assigned on Friday and be due at noon the following Friday. "Technical difficulties" are **not** grounds for an extension or special consideration. Start your homework early so that you can fix or work around any problems you may run into.

4.2 Exams

The midterms will be on the Friday of every third week of the semester. The final exam will be on Thursday, December 7 at 4pm. All tests will be in-class, closed-note, and closed-book. You will need to bring an NCS General Purpose Answer Sheets Form No. 16485 (the "purple form") to each exam.
